INTRODUCTION

Last day begins in Warren Commission. Delegates still impose their new theories upon who killed John F. Kennedy. The nuclear war still threatens the world. Delegates consider the assassination of John F. Kennedy may compromise the situation between the Soviet Union and the U.S., but some other consider to focus in the responsible of Kennedy's death basing on new evidence coming up from testimonies and Crisis Centre. Opinions within the committee are barely divided, however, delegates coincide in their objective: maintain order around the United States and provide security around the world.

MODEL DEVELOPMENT

Richard B Bussel begins the informal debate considering the Soviet Union as one of the responsables of the assassination. Considers investigation is doubtless and considers counterattacking the Soviet Union is key as he considers the Soviet Union has done enough at the U.S. territory. However, Howard Brennan responds stating instead of counterattacking, they must be sure the Soviet Union was responsible in order to avoid a possible WWII. Richard B Bussel disagrees with Brennan as he considers the evidence from yesterday which evidence Oswald connections with the USSR is enough to attack the USSR. Upgoing, Oswald's lawyer and Abraham Zapruder present their proofs which state Oswald wasn't involved in the assassination. He mentions Mr. Humer, autopsy doctor, admit he destroy the autopsy documents and didn't follow the correct procedure. Additionally, the lawyer mentions there was disappearing evidence and not enough to punish Oswald. The testimony of James Hosty, FBI agent, states his superiors asked him to destroy a letter from Oswald to FBI. Sean Andrews Jr. (Oswald's junior) accuses the FBI to hide information. Also, mentions Brennan's descriptions couldn't be accurate as the shooter's body is not totally showed. Andrews stated the rifle's bill of Oswald and the rifle's media description didn't coincide with the rifle he owned. Brennan responds to Andrews to be disrespectful and clarifies his testimony never mentioned the height of the individual as Andrews said he did. Brennan states the evidence of Andrews may not be veridical. Once the informal debate ended, a new Press Release was announced: new information acquired mentions Oswald's notebook may be a key evidence in the investigation which show high communist and marxism ideologies from Oswald which questions his motivations, this also demonstrated Lyndon B Johnson send \$3 million to Oswald. Brennan claims an attempted murder by George De Mohrenschildt, who may have connections with organized crime with the familial ties of Sam Giancana to Chicago Outfit. Hale Boggs will obtain total access to FBI documents to perform an individual investigation within a six-month period with a budget allocation of \$2 million. A deploying of FBI and CIA agents in Moscow will be done.

During the Lobby time, Jack Ruby's lawyer, Melvin Belli, obtain the testimony of Carlos Marcello within the committee. "What was your relationship with Jack Ruby?" - asked Belli. Marcello answered he barely knew him and answered he didn't knew about any tie with his organization and Oswald, and most importantly, Marcello admits Jack Ruby had no debt with the organization. Sam Giancana also answers: states Ruby and him had no interaction before his death. As Marcello, Giancana had no idea of any connections within Oswald and the organization. Giancana says he never made the order to kill Ruby. Furthermore, John Sherman initiates the informal debate accusing Lyndon B. Johnson of killing Kennedy to assume power hiring Oswald, a russian citizen, and Jack Ruby to assassinate Kennedy. States Jack Ruby killed Oswald as he was scared, Lyndon B. Johnson worked with the Mafia who silenced Jack Ruby. Brennan was still investigating, though, the Mafia tried to silence him, however, they failed in the attempt. Brennan along with Shaynefelt ordered an investigation with the FBI to obtain potential information about Oswald who stated the Soviet Union was the solution as well as his strong connection with Lyndon B. Johnson.
